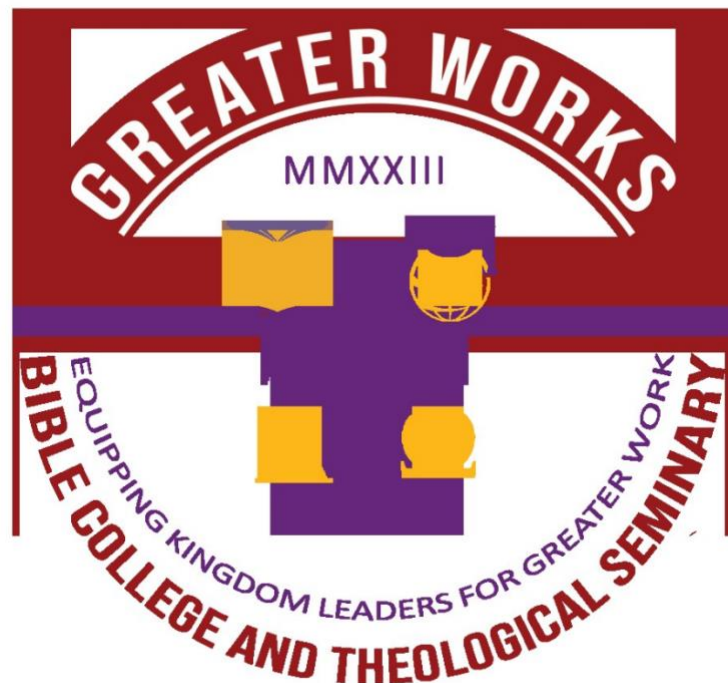

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OUR MISSION

The primary purpose of **Greater Works Bible College and Theological Seminary (GWBC&TS)** is to train and equip kingdom leaders for the greater work that Jesus Christ declared that His disciples would do (John 14:12). **GWBC&TS** is dedicated to providing students with a quality and affordable educational experience in order to be more effective in Christian service and challenged to reach the world for the cause of the Lord Jesus Christ.

LEGAL STATUS

Greater Works Bible College and Theological Seminary was created by Dr. Angelene Brinkley, and is an affiliate school of International College of Bible Theology (ICBT) and Midwest Seminary of Bible Theology (MSBT), a not-for-profit evangelical religious organization founded in 1990 and is an organization operating under foreign corporate status in the State of Missouri and is authorized to grant religious/theological diplomas and degrees.

Our mission is to help train and educate those who are called into the service of our Lord in a variety of Christian fields and ministries.

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

Greater Works Bible College and Theological Seminary considers the following truths to be fundamental to an understanding of our relationship to the One True and Living God.

➤ ONE TRUE GOD

The One True God is the eternally self-existent .I AM., the Creator of the universe. He has further revealed Himself as a triune Being, manifested as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. (Deut. 6: 4; Isa. 43: 10, 11; Isa. 48: 16; Matt. 28: 19; Lk. 3: 22)

➤ SCRIPTURES INSPIRED

All Scripture is verbally inspired by God as written in the original languages and is inerrant revelation of God to man. The Bible is the infallible authority for faith and conduct. (II Tim. 3:15-17; I Thess. 2:13; I Pet. 1: 21)

➤ THE LORD JESUS CHRIST

The Lord Jesus is 100% divine (Son of God) while simultaneously being 100% human (Son of Man). As God Incarnate, He is the express image of the Living God in human form. (Matt. 1: 23; Jn. 5: 22; II Jn. 3; Heb. 11:1-13)

➤ ORIGINAL SIN and FALL OF MAN

Man was created good and upright in the image and likeness of God. The first man, Adam, through disobedience, fell from the grace of God and, thus, sin and death entered into the world. Adam's transgression incurred not only physical death for man, but also spiritual death which is eternal separation from God. Man's propensity to sin because of his sinful nature necessitates salvation from the power of sin and a Savior to provide that salvation. (Gen. 1: 26, 27; Gen. 2:1-17, 3:4-6; Rom. 7: 13-25)

➤ SALVATION OF MAN

Man's only hope of redemption and salvation from sin is through the shed blood of the Lord Jesus Christ. His blood is completely sufficient to deliver every person from the power and penalty of sin. (Acts 4: 12; Rom. 5: 8-13, 10: 9; Ja. 1: 21; Eph. 2: 8)

➤ BAPTISM IN WATER

Baptism by immersion in water is commanded in the Scriptures. All who repent of their sins and believe in Christ as Savior and Lord are to be baptized. (Matt. 28: 19; Mark 16: 16; Acts 10: 47, 48; Rom. 6: 4; Col. 2: 11, 12)

➤ THE CHURCH AND ITS MISSION

The Church is the Body of Christ which is comprised of all believers. God inhabits the Body of Christ by the Holy Spirit both individually and corporately. Since God's purpose concerning man is to seek and to save that which is lost, for Him to be worshipped by man, and to build a body of believers in the image of His Son, the Church's responsibility is: 1. To evangelize the world; 2. To be a corporate Body in which man may worship and glorify God. (Acts 1: 8; Matt. 28: 19, 20; Mark 16: 15, 16; I Cor. 12: 28, 14: 12)

➤ HOLY COMMUNION

The Lord's Supper, consisting of bread and a cup of the fruit of the vine, is a memorial of Jesus' suffering and death and a celebration of His resurrection to be participated in by all believers until He comes again. (II Pet. 1: 4; I Cor. 11: 26)

➤ BAPTISM OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

The Baptism of believers in the Holy Spirit is evidenced by the initial physical sign of speaking with other tongues as the Holy Spirit gives utterance. This experience is distinct from and

subsequent to the experience of the new birth. With the baptism of the Holy Spirit comes the endowment of power for life and service and the bestowing of spiritual gifts. (Acts 2: 4; Lk. 24: 49; Acts 1: 4, 8; I Cor. 12: 1-31; Acts 8: 12-17, 10: 44-46, 15: 7-9, 19: 1-7)

➤ **EVER INCREASING FAITH**

Faith of heart is based on the hearing (spiritual understanding) of God's Word. Without faith it is impossible to please God. Christians are saved through faith, justified by faith, shall live by faith, and overcome the world by faith. (Rom. 10: 9, 10, 17; Heb. 11: 6; Eph. 2: 8; Rom. 3: 28, 5: 1; Gal. 2: 16, 3: 11; Rom. 1: 16, 17; Heb. 10: 38; I Jn. 5: 4)

➤ **DIVINE HEALING**

Divine healing is provided for in both the Old and New Testaments and is integral to the Gospel. (Ex. 15: 23-26; Ps. 103: 1-3; Isa. 53: 4, 5; Matt. 8: 16, 17; Acts 5: 16; Ja. 5: 14-16)

➤ **THE SECOND ADVENT OF CHRIST and THE FINAL JUDGMENT**

As the climax to God's dealing with man, Jesus is coming again. There will be a resurrection of the righteous and the wicked. The wicked will be judged, and the righteous will be ushered into the everlasting Kingdom of God. (I Thess. 4: 16, 17; Zech. 14: 5; Matt. 24: 27-30; Rev. 1: 7, 19: 11-14, 20: 1-6)

THE APPLICATION PROCESS

Each candidate/student desiring admission to GWBC&TS must submit a completed application packet and mailed to the Admissions Office.

When submitting or mailing your application, you will also need to supply the following items:

- Complete Resume.
- A brief biography listing all Christian and secular accomplishments.
- Copies of all degrees, transcripts, certificates, and other documentation.

Upon receipt of your application form and the other requested items, they will be assessed and compared with the requirements necessary to complete the degree program selected. Any gaps will need to be filled in.

A fee of \$50.00 must accompany the application.

About 1-2 weeks after receipt of your materials, we will send you a letter of acceptance and a list of what is needed to fulfill the requirements of the desired degree. Please contact the Administrations Office in reference to questions about your enrollment process and to assist you in completing any remaining requirements. Some of the ways this may be done are listed under, *How Credit is Earned*.

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TRANSFER OF AND GRANTING OF CREDIT HOURS

GWBC&TS will accept credits earned at any recognized university, college, or institution, if appropriate to the desired degree program. You will need to submit certified transcripts. Unofficial copies of transcripts are acceptable for purposes of the application, but official copies are required before credit is granted toward the degree. The credit will not be accepted if it has been previously used in fulfillment of any prior degree. Fees will be charged for transfer.

ACCEPTANCE OF DEGREES

The value of any college degree is subjective; depending upon many circumstances, conditions and needs. Most universities, colleges, institutions, agencies, etc., have their own specific criteria as to the recognition and acceptability of transferred credits. Therefore, if a student is going to transfer credits they would need to direct their questions to those institutions, or agencies as to the acceptance of credits. The college makes no guarantee. Nor, does a degree from **GWBC&TS** guarantee a job or ordination in any specific market or ministry.

The classes, degrees and programs of **GWBC&TS** are designed specifically to enhance the skills of those who are involved in Christian Ministry and are not designed or intended to be suited for

people pursuing jobs as public school teachers, state professors, state licensed psychologists, among other vocations. If you are taking courses to transfer them to other colleges, we recommend that you contact them before taking the courses. If you are desiring to obtain continuing educational credits or job promotions in your workplace for classes taken at **GWBC&TS**, please check with your employer regarding this prior to enrolling in any degree program.

ACADEMIC POLICIES

GWBC&TS reserves the right to immediately suspend or terminate a degree candidate for the following reasons:

- * .Inappropriate /Non-Christian behavior (by discretion of Chancellor/President)
- Falsification of records or work submitted for evaluation / assessment.
- Falsification of information to gain a discount, scholarship, or grant.
- Plagiarism.
- Nonpayment of tuition.
- Non-communication (one year of no response to inquiries).
- Use of the **GWBC&TS** degree and transcript for fraudulent purposes.

STUDENT RECORDS / PRIVACY ACT

Student records, other than name, date of enrollment, degree program, and date of graduation, will not be released to a third party without the student's written permission. This also includes any government officials or organizations, unless they have a warrant to do so.

Incomplete Grades:

Students who have not completed all requirements for a course because of extenuating circumstances, must obtain a Petition for Incomplete Grade form from the Instructor and have it approved by the course instructor. The petition will be sent to the office, along with a final grade sheet. A \$10.00 charge will be assessed for each petition submitted. All required work must be completed and submitted to the instructor within thirty days of the final class meeting. Instructors will assign incomplete grades as follows: I/B, I/C, I/D, I/F. Students who do not complete the required work within thirty days will receive the alternate grade (Example: B, C, D,

F) as assigned by the instructor.

Repeating Classes:

Upon approval of the instructor, a student may repeat a course for which a grade of 75 or below is received. The last grade received will be used in computing the student's cumulative grade point average.

GWBC&TS Calendar:

GWBC&TS operates on a trimester system. There are three 13 week trimesters in the school year. The school year starts the third week in August and ends the first week in June.

HOW CREDIT IS EARNED

All credit earned at **GWBC&TS** is based upon quarterly credit. Each certificate, diploma, degree, and major, at each level, has a required core curriculum, and a required number of degree major and elective courses. These can be found on pages 15 through 20.

Some of the methods used to obtain credits include, but are not limited to, the following (this applies to both classroom and correspondence students):

- Transcript courses from other colleges, universities, and institutions.
- Certificates and licenses.
- Credit by examination (CLEP, PEP, ACT).
- Workshops, seminars, training programs, counseling programs, AA programs, etc.
- Prior learning experiences arising from nontraditional means in living, working, and professional environments.
- Correspondence courses.

TUITION

Unlike most institutions of higher education, **GWBC&TS** does not charge by the credit. Instead, there is a flat fee charged for each degree level. There are no hidden costs or unnecessary add-ons. **Fees are subject to change.*

The tuition for each Certificate and Diploma program is as follows for 2024-2025:

AUDIT STUDENTS

The term “Audit Student” is for those individuals attending GWBC&TS strictly for their spiritual growth and enjoyment. The completion of coursework (homework, quizzes, exams and papers) will be optional. Auditing is for the individual’s own personal work and they will not receive any grade or credit.

Audit student attendance will not count toward the completion of “degree credits” and the audit student may not participate (as a student) in the graduation exercise. Audit students are required to comply with all school policies. Students desiring to change from an Audit Student to “degree credit” status must complete a new application within three weeks of the start of their initial 36 credit hour program.

The Audit fee is \$200.00 per course. This fee, which is to be paid at the start of the course, only covers the cost of the commentary and course syllabus, but does not include any books or other

materials.

DISCOUNTS

There is a discount of 20% off the tuition, at any degree level, for a spouse of an enrolled student. Before a discount may be given, the circumstances through which it is given must be verified.

REFUND POLICY

* Note – All tuitions are considered as a financial seed sowed to promote non-traditional accredited Christian Education. Full refunds are available only after the first week of class.

All academic program requirements and financial obligations must be met before any certificate, diploma, or degree will be awarded. A student may withdraw from a certificate, diploma or degree program at any time. However, we request that the intent be confirmed in writing.

WITHDRAWALS

A student desiring to withdraw from school before the end of a trimester must submit a completed withdrawal form to the Admissions Office. A student who withdraws officially will receive a grade of “W” (withdrawal) in all courses in which a passing grade has been maintained. A student who does not withdraw officially will result in forfeiture of any financial refund that would otherwise be due and receive a note on transcript of “incomplete”.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Requirements for Each Level of Degree

Only Degrees that are religious in nature, such as Bible Theology, Biblical Studies, Ministry, are awarded from GWBC&TS. Bible, Theology, and Practical Ministry courses are taught to give students a solid foundation. Some credit may be given from life experience and the transfer of some Liberal Arts credits may be applied. Percentile testing is allowed one time for a percentage of credit hours in Bible courses. Students are asked to submit a complete ministry and secular resume to be considered in their evaluation. Each applicant is an individual and each situation must be evaluated on an individual basis.

CERTIFICATE AND DIPLOMA PROGRAMS

The Certificate and Diploma programs are designed for those students who desire to learn and grow in the Word and may need a slower pace of study. Certificates and Diplomas can be earned in the areas of Biblical Studies or Bible Theology.

There is no prior academic requirement for entry into a Diploma Program except for a willingness to learn and the ability to read and write.

ASSOCIATE DEGREE PROGRAMS

The Associate program is designed to provide an introduction in the fields of study. The program is foundational and provides insight for both laity and those who wish to become involved in active ministry. A total of 72 trimester credits/units is required with a 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale.

For admission into the Associate's program, a candidate is required to have a high school diploma, a GED, or equivalent, or at the discretion of **GWBC&TS**.

BACHELOR DEGREE PROGRAMS

The Bachelor program is designed to provide enrichment in the areas of Biblical truths and effective ministry. Both the laity and those pursuing active ministry will benefit from the Bachelor program.

To enroll in the Bachelor degree program, an Associate's degree, the completion of sixty (60) credits, or its equivalent is required. A total of 120 credits (which includes the 60 credits from the Associate) is required with a 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale.

MASTERS PROGRAM

A Bachelor Degree of a religious nature is required to enter the Graduate program of Greater Works Bible College and Theological Seminary. If a candidate has a Bachelor Degree of a non-religious nature, the student must take 12 pre-requisite Bible courses at GWBC&TS prior to acceptance into the Graduate program.

An official transcript from college/colleges where Undergraduate Degree/Degrees were conferred are required. Sixty credit hours are required at this level to graduate. A Masters Thesis is also required to fulfill the graduation requirement for a Masters Degree.

DOCTORAL DEGREE PROGRAMS

To enter the Doctoral Graduate Program of GWBC&TS, the student must be active in ministry and have both a Bachelor and Master's Degree of a religious nature. If the Bachelor or Masters Degree is not of a religious nature, the student must take 12 pre-requisite Bible courses before entering the Doctoral program.

For admission into the Doctoral degree program, a candidate must have a Master's degree, the completion of 30-45 graduate level credits, or its equivalent.

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY DEGREE PROGRAM

For admission into the Ph.D. program, a candidate must have a Doctoral degree of a religious nature, the completion of 30-45 graduate level credits, or its equivalent. A Dissertation is also required to fulfill the graduation requirement for a Doctoral degree.

SENIOR PAPER, THESIS, AND DISSERTATION

Two copies of each senior paper, thesis, and/or dissertation will be required from the student. One copy will become the property of the school, and the other copy becomes the property of the student, and will be returned after grading.

All copyrights remain the sole property of the student. Therefore, if **GWBC&TS** desires to utilize, or publish, in any way a particular piece of work, the school will request permission from the student.

Senior Paper: Must be at least 10,000 words in length (app. 50 pages).

Master's Thesis: Must be at least 20,000 words in length (app. 80-100 pages).

Doctoral Dissertation: Must be at least 40,000 words in length (app. 150-200 pages).

Ph.D. Dissertation: Must be at least 50,000 words in length (app. 200 pages)

All subject topics must first be approved.

Guidelines on writing a Senior Paper, a Master Thesis, or a Doctoral Dissertation, will be made available to the student upon request.

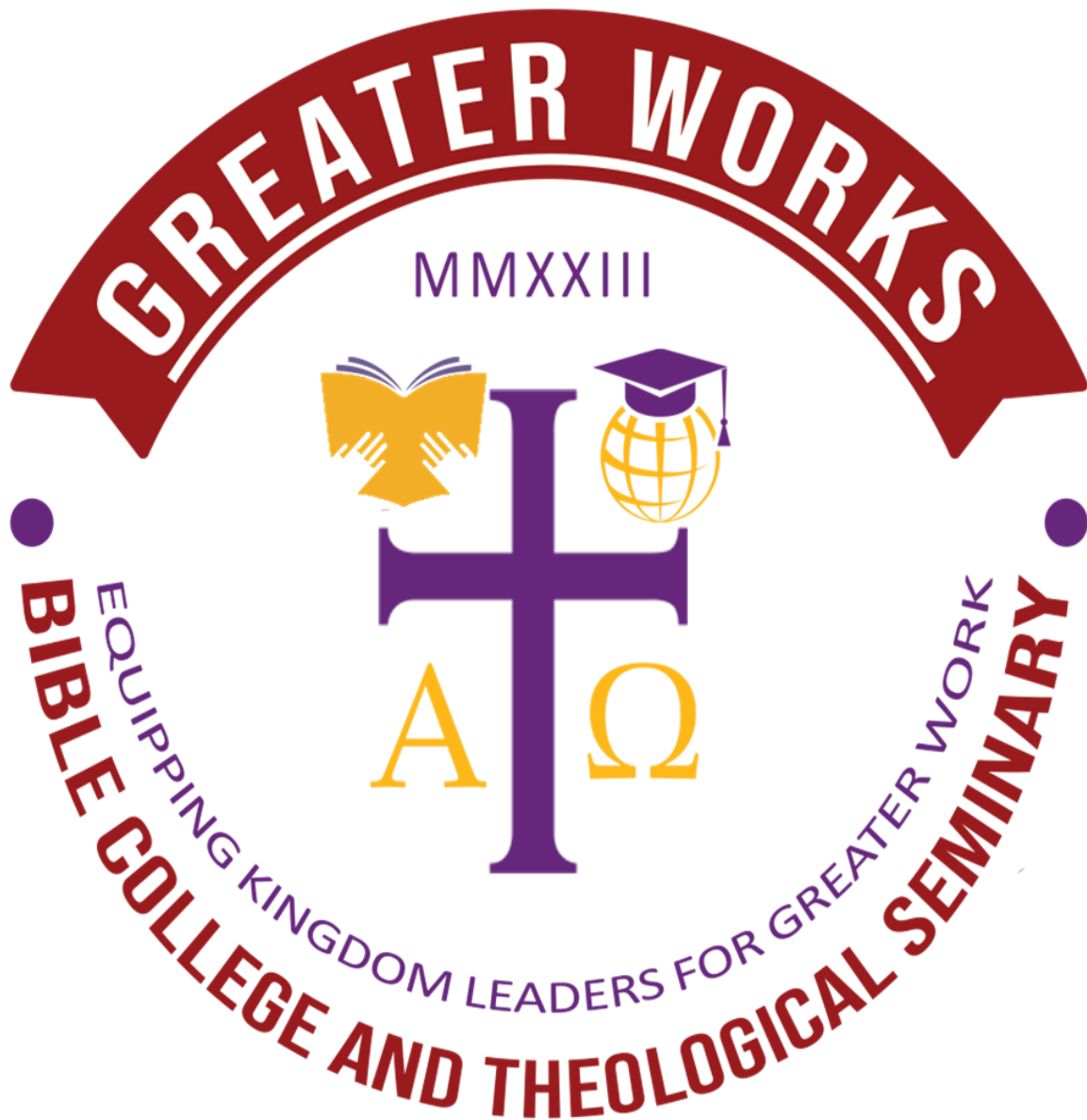

Graduate Courses

- GCCS - 500 **Hereditary Traits – 3 credits**
 This is a study of sinful traits that are passed on by the fathers to the children.
- GCCS - 510 **Spiritual Navigation – 3 credits**
 The course takes a look at counseling the person who is trying to navigate toward destiny in Christ.
- GCCS - 520 **Abnormal Psychology – 3 credits**
 A study of abnormal behaviors due to thinking that violates social mores and standards.
 Suggested textbook – Complete Family Guide to Schizophrenia – Kim T. Mueser and Susan Gingerich.
- GCCS - 530 **Conflict Management and Resolution – 3 credits**
 This course contains principles for addressing conflict in the ministry, mission field, and business world. Suggested textbook – The Eight Essential Steps to Conflict Resolution-Dudley Weeks.

- GCCS - 540 Pastoral Counseling – 3 credits**
An understanding of the problems a parishioner faces in personal and interpersonal, as well as family issues, with directions on helping meet those needs by Holy Spirit and by Scripture.
- GCCS – 550 Christian Counseling I – 3 credits**
Studying the counselor, their personal issues, as well as interpersonal issues and family issues.
- GCCS- 560 Christian Counseling II – 3 credits**
A study of the issues that people face, including identity and developmental issues, as well as dealing with addictions, finances, vocational and spiritual issues.
- GCCS - 570 Victorious Christian Living – 3 credits**
This course uses a counselor's viewpoint to look at the reason the believer can be victorious, with the fact of facing hindrances to that victory, and the use of faith to win the victory in every situation.
- GCCS - 600 Divine Guidance – 3 credits**
A study of the ways and methods of God in guiding a person to his potential in Christ.
Suggested textbook –Experiencing the Holy Spirit – Andrew Murray.
- GCCS - 605 God's Perspective on Marriage – 3 credits**
This course examines mate selection and preparation for marriage with principles to have a successful marriage from God's viewpoint.
- GCCS - 610 Crisis Counseling I – 3 credits**
A study of the biblical perspective for crisis and application of biblical principles to the counseling process. Suggested textbook – Crisis and Trauma Counseling – Dr. H. Norman Wright
- GCCS - 620 Crisis Counseling II – 3 credits**
A study of the crisis of death, divorce, transitions, children and adolescents, and the Type A Personality, as well as Scriptures for counseling, prayer, and confidentiality issues.
Suggested textbook – Crisis and Trauma Counseling – Dr H. Norman Wright
- GCCS -623 Counseling for Change – 3 credits**
Covers a wide spectrum of counseling issues with avenues to bring about change in the counselee.
- GCCS -629 Counseling. Psychology and the Christian – 3 credits**
This course studies the composite of the Christian with emphasis on the contrast between his mind, will, emotions, and human spirit.
- GCCS -630 Marriage Counseling – 3 credits**
A Study of the process and critical issues of pre-ceremony and post-ceremony marriage counseling.
- GCCS - 635 Dealing with Anger – 3 credits**
A study of how a believer can deal with and defeat anger's effort to stymie their growth in the Lord.
- GCCS - 640 Bioethics and Pastoral Care (CICC – 618 by Cohen Institute) - 3 credits**
A view of the necessity of pastoral care and the ethics questions involved, with a theological explanation and critique. Book required – Bioethics and Pastoral Care – Sondra Ely Wheeler

- GCCS - 650 **Suicide and the Evil Force Behind It – 3 credits**
A study of suicide in biblical and secular history, viewing the morality, reasons for suicide, and what can be done to prevent it as well as bring healing to families of its victims.
Suggested textbook – Suicide Prevention, Intervention, Postvention – Earl Grollman

- MIS - 111 **Introduction to Personal Evangelism – 3 credits**
An introductory level course on witnessing and effectively sharing the Gospel.
Suggested textbook – So You Want to be a Missionary? - Dr. Roger Price
- MIS - 200 **An Introduction to the Theology of Mission – 3 credits**
Looking at the theological reasons for being involved in missions around the world.
Suggested textbook – A Biblical Theology of Missions – George Peters
- MIS - 230 **World Geography – 4 credits**
This is a study of global geography.
- MIS - 232 **Biblical Foundations for World Missions – 3 credits**
History of Christian missions and the biblical foundation for world missions.
Suggested textbook – A Concise History of the Christian World Mission – J. Herbert Kane
- MIS - 340 **Comparative Religions – 3 credits**
A study of world religions including false cults in comparison to Christianity.
- MIS - 343 **Trends in Mission I – 3 credits**
An initial study of trends and phenomena involved in the methods and machinery employed by God for world harvest. Suggested textbook – The Indigenous Church – Melvin L. Hodges
- MIS - 353 **Trends in Missions II – 3 credits**
A view of world trends as they relate to the world of Missions.
- MIS - 411 **Relational Evangelism – 3 credits**
A study of the use of relationships as the tool for evangelism.
Suggested textbook -God's Greatest Passion – H.L. Hussman
- MIS - 420 **Religions of the World – 3 credits**
A study of the major religions of the world and the truths of the Word of God that refute the claims of non-Christian religions.
Suggested textbook – Handbook of Today's Religions -Josh McDowell

Graduate Courses

- GMIS - 511 **Personal Evangelism – Winning the Lost – 3 credits**
An in-depth look at avenues of evangelism for reaching the world.
Suggested textbook – The School of Biblical Evangelism – Ray Comfort and Kirk Cameron

- GMIS - 520 Mission of the Church – Discipleship – 3 credits**
A study of the practical application of obedience, intercession and discipleship.
Suggested textbook – The Complete Book of Discipleship – Bill Hull
- GMIS - 530 Mobilizing the Church for Mission – 3 credits**
A study of practical ways to awaken the local church to her purpose of taking the Gospel to the whole world.
- GMIS - 540 Church Planting – 3 credits**
A study of the Church Planting Movement, especially in light of a Hindu culture.
- GMIS - 550 Examining the Woman’s Place in Ministry – 3 credits (PENDING)**
A view of the woman’s role in ministry, with a view toward missions.
- GMIS - 560 The World of Mission – 3 credits**
Looking at the charge of God for Mission, including the “Lostness” of man and a Biblical Foundation for World Mission. Suggested textbook – Operation World – Jason Mandryk
- GMIS - 600 So You Want to be a Missionary? - 3 credits**
An in-depth look at the call, preparation, and entrance into mission work. Suggested textbook – The Missions Addiction – Dr. David Shibley
- GMIS - 610 Church Planting – 3 credits**
Contains the discussion of strategies to reach a people group.
Suggested textbook – The Bridges of God – Donald McGavran
- GMIS - 620 The General Missionary Call – 3 credits**
A look at the Missionary Responsibility of the Body of Christ, with a view toward church planting and motivating the local church toward Missions. Suggested textbook – Missionary Methods.... St. Paul’s or Ours? Roland Allen
- GMIS - 660 World Religions – 4 credits**
An in-depth study of the cults, occult, secular religions, non-Christian religions, and orthodox Christianity.
- Worldwide Perspectives – 6 credits**
A specialized study of the world – wide call to missions. Textbook required.
- Short Term Missions**
Short Term Mission trips are made available through American Mission Teams and Internationald Gospel Outreach. Ministry trips are available several times each year to Africa, India, Asia, Europe, South and Central America. These trips demonstrate the need for teaching ministry, preaching, evangelism, medical and social development.
- BPA - 230 Living Epistles – 3 credits**
This course teaches the believer how to walk with God without succumbing to the little foxes that seek to destroy the believer’s testimony. Textbook required – Little Foxes - Bertist Rouse

Ministry and Mission School

Ministry and Mission Summer School- up to 39 credits if courses taken home to complete. This is a special two-week Mission School consisting of 90 hours of lecture and 30 hours of internship. The number of credits given is determined by the amount of projects and assignments assigned and completed by the student over a period of a year following the lecture time. This special program also contains hands-on projects. Credit achievable is specific to the student level of study, with 15-21 credits for time on site.

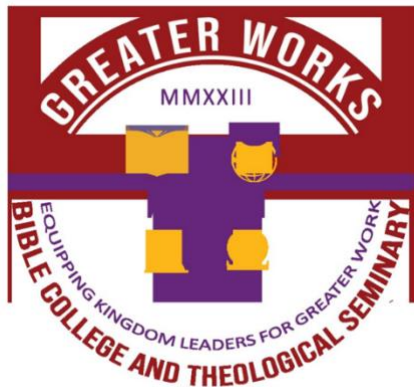
Program Completion Research and Study

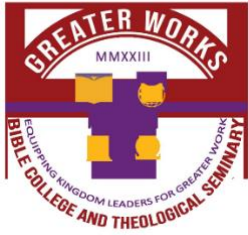

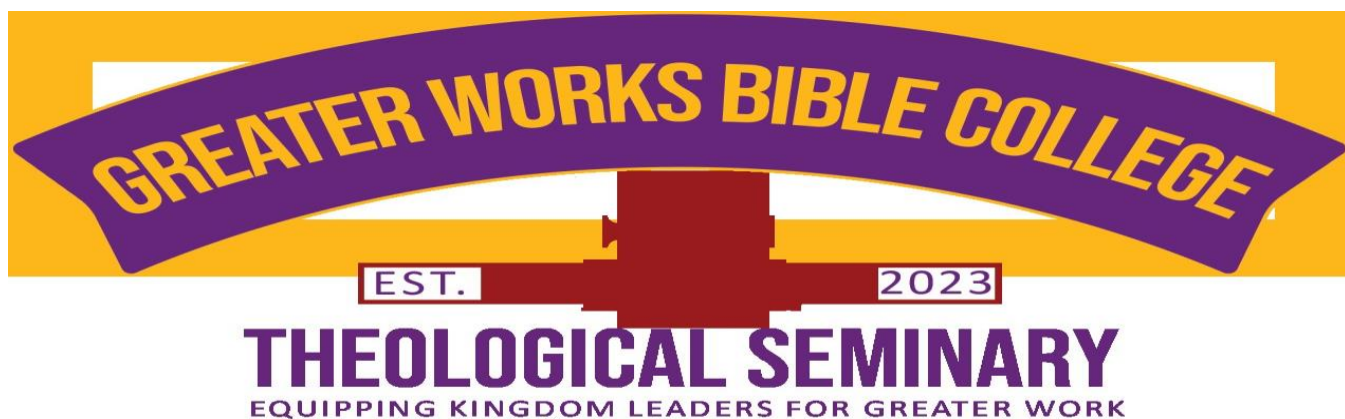
